Delta Dental Companies Team Up Again for Missions of Mercy

This is the second group donation organized by Delta Dental. "Last year we learned that Delta Dental member companies throughout the country shared DDOK's vision for partnering with Missions of Mercy when we collectively contributed funds to purchase the dental chairs, portable delivery units and Cavitron scalers for a MOM trailer," said John Gladden, President and CEO of Delta Dental of Oklahoma. "That inspired us to expand our vision and cover the costs of an entire trailer load this year. Wherever there are volunteer dental professionals willing to donate their time and skills, we want to ensure there is the necessary equipment to support their efforts."

Bruce Bergstrom is the executive director of ADCF and sees the number of MOM events nearly doubling soon. "Last year, Missions of Mercy were held in 16 states and we expect as many as 14 new states to begin conducting MOM events over the next two years," Bergstrom said. "We're grateful to Delta Dental for helping us support that number of events through this generous donation."

Mission of Mercy events have helped more than 100,000 patients and provided nearly \$50 million in free dental services since 2000.
